In Noel Coward's *Present Laughter*, Garry Essendine (Terry Coolen) is a self-centred actor whose every move is a performance. He is surrounded by adoring women, and employees who cater to his whims. Coward is, of course, a master of elegant language and dry wit, and much of the humour comes from the way Essendine overstates everything and the way his wise –cracking assistant Monica Reed (Helen Goodwin) understates things. There are some very funny moments in this production (Sandi Montgomery gets lots of laughs as the chain–smoking, slow–moving Swedish housekeeper), but the soap–opera–like plot is simply not enough to hold one's attention for two and half hours. I'd have to say this is a near–miss that is ultimately sunk by drawn–out timing and a mish–mash of wonky accents.
