UPDATE ON CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

Building On Our Past for a Better Future -Fund Raising Campaign

The Theatre Art Guild's capital fund raising campaign to raise \$170,000, which included renovations and additions to the dressing rooms, props and costumes area, and the addition of a workshop, is nearing completion.

The program, which was partially financed by a Canada 150 Grant from the Federal Government, is almost complete. In addition to individual requests, we have held a Paint Nite, a raffle and a Mad Hatter's Afternoon Tea Party to raise additional funds.

We have **less than \$10,000 left** before we reach our goal. As you may be aware, the last 5% of any

campaign is the most difficult to goal to reach.
