# **TAG ONLINE**

TAG Digital, The Theatre Arts Guild virtual stage, started as a response to the COVID-19 lockdowns in June 2020, in collaboration with The Telescope Theatre Project. Its aim is to share new, familiar, and obscure works of poetry, prose, and plays, and provide an educational, relaxing, and creative process for participants who desire to take part in a production, but are unable to commit to the demands of a live production. Since September 2020, they have released audio and video productions, made primarily available on YouTube.

The Telescope Theatre Project was a creative, collaborative cooperative of storytelling enthusiasts, with interests in poetry, prose, and plays. Formed in 2013 by Kaylon Fraser, Melinda Antle, and Joshua Law, their ultimate goal was to explore new, familiar, and lost works, and share them with artists and audiences. Following the amalgamation with TAG in 2021, the Project dissolved, but Telescope remains as a producer within TAG.

#### Episode 13

#### A Picture is Worth a Thousand Words

I hope that, the next time you are at the Pond Playhouse you take a few minutes to look around the lobby. I know that many of our audience meet up with friends there and like to catch up on the news (!), but there are many items that you can view in this space which all help tell the story of our community theatre.

Let's start our tour on the east side of the lobby, in front of the bar. To your right you will find the latest issue of the TAG Newsletter — Contact, published with that title since TAG's founding in 1931. Next comes information on membership and the opportunity to install a plaque in the auditorium on one of the seats in honour of a friend or a loved one. Passing the main door, on the south wall are displays of posters for our current season and posters of other organizations with which we have ties. In the corner here is a recent addition to the history of Jollimore, the bell which used to belong to the Parkhill United Church (now closed). Rich Knowles worked on the bell's restoration and J Carruth made the 'clock case' frame. Then you must look up! The screen above the bell case displays both pictures and text from the production you are about to see, plus information about upcoming shows and other events which will form our 2023/2024 season. By the entrance to the washrooms is a colourful display created by Cheryl Theriault and Brenda Tyedmers (with the frame again by J Carruth) which lists financial supporters of the Guild, principally those who made possible the building of the lobby and the rehearsal hall which is above it. Now we can head down the ramp towards the theatre, with a stop on the right-hand side to look at the display board for the current production,

featuring not only the actors, but the technical personnel as well. It takes a bunch of dedicated souls to present plays to you and this is where you can identify them and their contribution.

One final stop – and the main reason for writing this issue! Just before you enter the theatre, on the west side of the lobby is a picture, a disturbing one and one that marks a black day in the history of TAG. The painter was Catherine Weld and the event depicted was on January 25 th, 1959. The building seen on the canvas is the fourth home of TAG, formerly the College Street School. This school, part of the Catholic school system of the time and staffed by the sisters of the Sacred Heart Convent, was replaced in 1952 by St. Francis Elementary School (now Inglis Street Elementary), at the junction of Inglis and Robie Streets. The Guild was lucky enough to secure the top floor of the now empty building, which already had a stage. The space on this upper level allowed for a refreshment area, plus storage for props, sets and costumes and an office. TAG's fortunes improved in this home – membership soared and houses were full. I don't think that the origin of the fire was ever determined, but apparently, another theatre group was renting space in the basement of the building and it was in this lower area that the fire started and quickly spread to the upper floors. All those in the building were able to escape, but the upper floors eventually collapsed. TAG's sets, props and costumes, archival material - all was lost (to the value of \$80,000). Embodying the theatre motto - "The show must go on," the play being rehearsed that night, Candida by George Bernard Shaw was presented nineteen days later in the auditorium of St. Patrick's High School. The loss of the College Street space proved a hard blow from which to recover. The executive of the time moved to a house close by in Victoria Street and performances continued in a variety of venues for the next few years - Queen Elizabeth II High School, Prince Arthur Junior High School in Dartmouth and the Atlantic Room of the Nova Scotian Hotel (now the Westin Hotel). The damage was done however, and the group once again faced a considerable drop in membership and financial support. It took until 1966 for a new home to be found, the former Church Hall of St. Augustine's Anglican parish, aptly renamed the Pond Playhouse!
